- Keep Regis University informed of current employment details~
- Consider becoming a mentor Educator to future recipients of this scholarship~



Guidelines:

- Must be an adult student in the Undergraduate Teacher Education program~
- Plan to conduct Student Teaching in the following academic semester / year~
- Have passed the PLACE or PRAXIS~
- Complete Student Teaching semester in a HIGH-NEED school~
 - High Need:*
 - 50% or more free/reduced lunch
 - Title I schools
 - To check your schools eligibility go to the Colorado Department of Education website www.cde.state.co.us and click on "Accountability Reports"*
- Demonstrate significant financial need by completing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by appropriate deadline~
- Submit application and essay by appropriate deadline:
 - Fall - February
 - Spring -September
 - See application for exact date*
- Applications will be reviewed by an Undergraduate Teacher Education panel~
- Scholarship recipient(s) will be notified by a member of the panel and awarded accordingly~
